- ❑ The Lymes' Senior Center is a municipal agency that is part of the towns of Old Lyme and Lyme and serves both retired and working members of the community 55 and better. It also houses the local VFW post, town nurse and is the respite center during weather emergencies/power outages.
- ❑ The center was built in 1995-96, with HVAC upgrades accomplished in 2016. Both towns are responsible for the building and grounds with a 75/25 split in funding.
- ❑ All programs and activities offered at the center are funded solely by membership dues and donations.
- ❑ The building committee was charged by the towns to look at renovation and reconfiguration of the center in response to increasing challenges meeting the needs of its membership.



# Delays and Budgetary Challenges

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- ❑ Despite provision in the timelines, we ran into delays on two administrative fronts after we had began preparing for anticipated Sept/Oct handover to construction team.
- ❑ Even as the delays elongated, we were unable to move back into the building. We were also unable to issue Bid Packages in Sept 2023 as planned at risk of rendering expenditures ineligible for the STEAP grant reimbursements.
- ❑ Bid packages were able to be released in January 2024 and received back timely on February 6, 2024. The trade bids were \$1.1M over budget. Related “soft costs” raised the total variance to \$1.3M.
- ❑ Almost \$600k of construction savings were identified without reducing the expansion, exterior features, or multi-room flexibility, all while maintaining quality of materials. At the same time, owners' contingencies have been increased by almost \$65,000 to provide additional funds for unforeseen conditions.
- ❑ By these actions, the \$1.3M overage has been reduced to \$800,000. This amount must be approved at Town Meeting to move forward engaging vendors and beginning construction. The bids we have in hand expire May 6, 2024.
- ❑ In addition, the Building Committee and the Towns' Boards of Selectpeople recommend approving an appropriation of \$80,000 to allow for upgrades to the kitchen space, which was not in the scope of the original \$5.5M appropriation.


ARTIST'S RENDERING - INTERIOR SPACE, SINGLE GREAT ROOM CONFIGURATION




# Funding Sources

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1. Old Lyme and Lyme Town Budgets ...Each town must approve its share of total costs
2. Community Facilities Grant ...Applied for but denied
3. STEAP Grants ...\$1 million approved (Reimbursement; \$500k per town)
4. CT Dept Aging & Disability Services ...Towns will apply for this ARPA grant; \$37k opportunity
5. Private Fundraising ...Private contributions will be encouraged




# Original Project Timeline (May 2023)






# Revised Project Timeline
